## Trull Primary School Wireless

Trull enable greater ICT access with the use of wireless

### Background to the project

In the Summer Term of 2009 Trull School embarked on a journey to implement a whole school wireless network. The school currently has an ICT Suite that is limited and were looking to enable greater ICT access throughout the school.

Trull School were looking to implement a solution that was scalable, future proof and that would have enough bandwidth to cope with the ever growing demand of digital content within the curriculum.

The school also wanted piece of mind if they had any technical support issues they would have the backup of experts.

### Solution

To ensure the school could translate their vision into reality, Trull Primary School called on Integrated Data Needs (IDN) to help scope out the project.

IDN carried out a free site survey and consultancy visit, and using our vast experience and knowledge within the education sector, IDN came up with 2 solutions that both fitted the schools needs. After discussing the pros and cons to both solutions it was decided that a Cisco solution would be used.
